


2022 MEMBERSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

- AMLE launched six new constituent committees comprised of to provide members with a new way to guide the work of the organization.
- AMLE's Foundation Fund supported members through numerous grant and awards programs, and recognized amazing leaders through its Legacy Circle inductions.
- AMLE launched a Student Ambassador program, creating a supported network of promising pre-service teachers.
- AMLE supported our LGBTQ+ colleagues and students through local partnerships in conjunction with the Anual Conference in Orlando, Florida
- AMLE's popular *Middle School Journal* saw an 8% increase in article downloads.

THE SUCCESSFUL MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM

In 2022 AMLE expanded our impact through meaningful, evidence based professional development opportunities designed to be accessible for all schools. We continued the launch of the Successful Middle School Program, designed to help schools actualize the vision of AMLE's foundational position paper, *The Successful Middle School: This We Believe.* amle.org/sms



The anchor of the Program, The Successful Middle School Assessment, helps schools baseline their implementation of the 18 characteristics of successful middle schools. Schools can also choose to engage their parents/caregivers and students in the process.

After an overwhelming response to the survey after its launch, AMLE engaged researchers to analyze the anonymized data with an aim of supporting insights and research that will advance the field of middle level education as a whole. In 2022, work was completed to statistically validate the survey – with exciting insights to be published in 2023!


In total, AMLE conducted

Planning is underway for AMLE50, our 50th anniversary conference! The event will be held in National Harbor, Maryland in November, 2023. amle.org/annual






LEVEL LEADERSHIP





The Successful Middle School: This We Believe and referred journals, Middle School Journal and Research in Middle Level Education Online.


